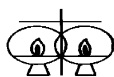

Feast of Ascension

Dear friends: The Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord is a Mystery. Scripture tell us that Jesus left His disciples to go back to the heavenly Father, and promised to return at the end time. He concluded His earthly ministry and with this began the mission of the church. In today's gospel, the disciples were saying goodbye to Jesus and we heard the intimate moment of farewell between friends.
